

ABOUT THE SOCIETY...

Cambridgeshire Records Society publishes a wide range of documents and maps relating to the county (including the Isle of Ely and Huntingdonshire). Records are chosen for their value to research and are edited voluntarily to the highest standards by specialists in the relevant field. Each publication includes a substantial scholarly introduction placing the item in context.

Our publications include diaries and letters, field surveys, farming accounts, a tax list, parish church, school and nonconformist records, and maps. The documents are drawn from a wide range of national and local archives and cover all periods from the Middle Ages to the twentieth century. All publications are on sale at the Cambridgeshire Collection, Cambridge Central Library, and some map publications at Cambridgeshire Archives, Shire Hall. The Society is a not-for-profit organisation and depends wholly on its membership. An annual meeting, at which reports and accounts are presented and the officers and committee are elected, is held in conjunction with a lecture, exhibition or visit to a local place of historic interest.

The Society aims to publish a volume a year, and members receive a free copy of every volume published during their membership. In addition, they are entitled to buy previous publications, most of which are still in print, at the members' rate of about two-thirds the non-member price.
